# Ned's Notes

POSTING YOUR SCORES - 2011

Bob Poe, 2011 Handicap Chairman

The season in our area for posting scores begins on March 15th and ends November 15<sup>th</sup>. Away rounds, played in warmer climates (Florida, Las Vegas, Mexico, etc), should be posted all year long. The handicap computer will be turned on March 15<sup>th</sup> for posting this season's rounds.

The Golf Committee has assigned the Handicap Committee the responsibility to monitor and ensure members have valid handicaps. If you do not post ALL your scores, either in the computer or next to your name on the daily sign-in sheet, you MAY NOT have a valid handicap. Simply placing a completed score card in the box next to the sign-in sheet DOES NOT constitute posting a score. Frequently initials, nicknames or first names are the only name on the card and it is impossible to determine with certainty the identity of all golfers. The responsibility to post scores is YOURS AND YOURS ALONE.

This year the Handicap Committee has been empowered by the Golf Committee to adjust (up or down) any member's handicap considered to be questionable, IF NECESSARY. The Handicap Committee members will be anonymous with the exception of the Chairman. In addition for the men, there will be a new tournament rule. If you have a net score in a Grand Prix event that is 5 or more strokes lower than the next best net score, your score will be entered twice as a tournament round. This should not have any impact on your handicap unless the scores you subsequently post are statistically higher than your tournament scores.

Last year we have made one change to the DAILY SIGN-IN SHEET. Please use your handicap number, not member number when signing-in each day. Many families have spouses or children with the same initial in their first name. Each member – husband, wife and children have a unique handicap number.

The USGA requires that all 9 AND 18 hole scores be posted in a timely manner using equitable stroke control. It is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY to see that your scores are posted. Ned and his staff will post your Hawthorne scores for you if you record them on the daily sign-in sheet.

Nine-hole scores must be posted any time you complete at least 7 holes of play.

Eighteen-hole scores must be posted any time you complete at least 13 holes of play.

If a player does not finish a round because of weather, darkness, etc. and has played at least 7 holes or if a player has completed at least 13 holes, then a nine or eighteen hole score respectfully, must be posted. The USGA handicap system states that if a player does not play a hole, his score for that hole for handicap purposes shall be par plus any strokes he is entitled to receive on that hole. When recording this hole-score, the score should be preceded by an "X".

If a player starts but does not complete a hole or is conceded a stroke, he shall record for handicap purposes the score he most likely would have made and such a score shall not exceed the limit provided by Equitable Stroke Control. This probable hole-score should be preceded by an "X".

Equitable Stroke Control is the downward adjustment of individual hole scores for handicap purposes in order to make handicaps more representative of a player's potential ability. ESC sets a maximum number that a player can post on any hole depending on the player's individual handicap. It is used only when a player's actual or most likely score exceeds his maximum number based on the table below:

COURSE HANDICAP	MAXIMUM NUMBER ON A HOLE
9 or less	double bogey
10 thru 19	7
20 thru 29	8
30 thru 39	9
40	10

Example: John has a Course Handicap of 12 and therefore has a maximum number for any hole of 7, regardless of par being 3, 4, or 5. He may be having a difficult time on hole number 12 (PAR 3) at HCC and take 11 strokes but he may only count 7 when posting the score.

If you only play four holes after work (example - 8 and 9 twice), you may want to sign-in with 4 holes not 9. If you play more than one ball each hole AND can't remember which ball was your original tee shot, it is a practice round and should not be posted. You may want to write "practice" or "P" next to the number of holes when you sign-in, or complete play. However, your fellow golfers rightly may question numerous practice rounds each month when no scores are posted and you later shoot an exceptional tournament score.

Scores made in our golf season (March 15 thru November 15), when the local rule of "preferred lies" (winter rules) are in effect, SHALL BE POSTED for handicap purposes. "Preferred Lies" means a ball lying on a fairway may be lifted and cleaned, without penalty, and placed within one club-length of where it originally lay, not nearer the hole, and so as to preserve as nearly as possible the stance required to play the original lie.

Your handicap should reflect your current ability. If you have a recent physical injury or your last 20 rounds posted, cover more than one year, the Committee may adjust your handicap to insure fairness in competitive events.

Associate Non Equity Golf Membership Program  
Frequently Asked Questions

**What is the Associate Non-Equity Golf Membership Program?**

Hawthorne Country Club is offering for a limited time, an Associate Non-Equity Golf Membership. It is available as a Single or Family membership. You must be 18 years of age or older to apply for this membership. This membership gives you access to golf only. No other club privileges or voting rights are included. You may play golf at the designated times for a fee. See below for fees. This membership is available for the 2011 Golf Season only. This offer will expire on May 31, 2011. The Membership will be valid for one year from the activation date.

**What is the fee to join?**

The Individual Membership is \$299 and the Family Membership is \$399. Should you choose to convert your membership to a voting membership; Hawthorne will waive your initiation fee.

**How many memberships will be available?**

50

**Who is eligible for this membership?**

Anyone in our community may join subject to Board approval. If you were a prior member of Hawthorne Country Club, you may not apply for this membership if you resigned on or after June 1, 2010.

**How do I apply for this membership?**

All potential Associate members must fill out an application and be approved by the Board. The Board reserves the right to deny or revoke any membership at their discretion.

**When can I play golf and do I need a tee time?**

Hawthorne Country Club does not have tee times. You may play golf anytime during the posted hours. You may not tee off before 11:00 am on Saturday, Sundays or Holidays.

**What are the fees associated with this membership?**

The price for greens fees and cart rental are as follows:

Weekday's	\$20.00/9 holes	\$30.00/18 holes
Weekend's and Holidays	\$25.00/9 holes	\$35.00/18 holes

**Guest Fee:**

Weekday's	\$23.50/9 holes	\$37.00/18 holes

**Can I bring a guest to play?**

**How will I pay for the rounds I play?**

You will be billed on the first of the month for the prior month's charges.

**Am I able to play in organized tournaments and events?**

You will not be able to play in any Men's Golf Association tournaments but, may participate in the Men's Thursday Night League, Mixed Events and any Social Events. Voting members of Hawthorne Country Club will have the first right of participation in those events.
